# 4. New Business/Action Items

# 4.1. Community Action Board (CAB) Report

Padilla and Rogers shared key updates on CAB's ongoing work and recent achievements, emphasizing increased Latino and Zapotec representation in organization and Board leadership, strengthened connections to the farmworker community, and expanded bilingual communications. Major initiatives include long-standing programs like rental assistance and youth homelessness services, alongside new projects such as a planned shelter with tiny homes and 24/7 security. They also highlighted Cab's four focus areas: homelessness prevention, youth development and employment, the Davenport Resource Center, and crisis response efforts. Notable accomplishments include distributing \$14M in pandemic relief—60% of which supported undocumented individuals—and a commitment to responsive programming guided by biennial surveys of low-income communities.

CAB continues to advocate for immigrant rights through forums like a recent immigration event at Watsonville High School, offering legal consultations and "Know Your Rights" education. As the only Central Coast affiliate of Unidos US, CAB focuses on equity and leadership development while maintaining programs like Luna y Sol for youth and wrap-around day-worker services to promote job stability. Their 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations include a May community carnival and

an October celebration showcase. The organization welcomes support through sponsorships, referrals, and feedback while remaining committed to evolving with the needs of the communities it serves.

Commission discussed partnering with Community Action Board staff to create an art wall display celebrating CAB's 60th anniversary and highlighting their achievements over the years.
